

IRS Indexed Limits for 2022

The 2022 IRS indexed dollar limits for qualified retirement plans are provided in the table below. This update is for informational purposes and is not intended as legal advice.

- 2. Available to employees age 50 or older during the calendar year. A lower limit applies to SIMPLE plans.*
- 3. All compensation from a single employer (including all members of a controlled group) must be aggregated for purposes of this limit.*
- 4. For the 2022 plan year, an employee who earns more than \$130,000 in 2021 is an HCE. For the 2023 plan year, an employee who earned more than \$135,000 in 2022 is an HCE.*
